Changes to managing behaviour

You might have heard your child recently talking about pegs and red, green or yellow circles or behaviour in school. At the end of last term, all staff felt that general behavior of children around school was not always as we expected or wanted and as a result, we have introduced 5 core conduct rules which children are working very hard to adhere to.

The rules are designed by the children to help them feel safe and practice basic expectations of citizens everywhere. They're not the kind of things that get success points either; we should all follow these without expecting or desiring a reward. Our rules are:

The 3 Ws; Watching walking waiting. Focuses on how we move around the site, at doorways, in the corridor etc.

Smartly, sensibly, silently

This relates to how we line up and how we signify the change between playtimes and learning times. We will be clamping down on this at the beginning of the day too.

Doing what you know is right This sounds simple but we want children to work hard on this; only being in at playtime if you have a responsibility, going into lunch with your buddy, putting equipment away, keeping hands and feet to yourself – your child will be able to add more!

Use your manners (ps & qs) We think please and thank you and general kindness should be a bog standard feature of children's interactions with each other and adults around them.

Parent Governor vacancy

We have a vacancy for a parent governor which we need to fill as soon as possible. Stockbridge Primary & Pre-school has always aimed for a partnership with parents, which undoubtedly brings great benefits to the children. One of the most significant ways you can help in promoting this aim is to volunteer to be a parent governor.

The governing body's main tasks are:-

- to ensure that the school has a clear vision, ethos and strategic direction.
- to hold the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils.
- to oversee the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

Parent governors are welcomed as valued members of the team and play a vital role in ensuring the governing body is aware of the views of parents and the local community. We feel sure that there are parents prepared to take on this important role and give their time and commitment to helping us to continue to improve the school's performance. We meet once a month as a full governing body – no sub committees!

In looking to fill this vacancy the governors of the school have identified the following skills, experience and attributes that they feel would help strengthen the governing body:-

- Knowledge of the local community and how the school contributes.
- Interest in and awareness of children's education, including peschool
- Dedicated commitment to the responsibility of the role; including regular attendance at governors' meetings; regular school visits to monitor and assess the effectiveness of school policy; participation on governors' training courses.

Training and support will be available to help you develop into the role. This will include in-house mentoring and support as well as access to external governor training. If you feel you can help in this capacity please contact the office or email Mrs Jefferies <u>e.jefferies@stockbridge.hants.sch.uk</u> for an application form which will need to be completed and returned to the school by 12.00 noon on Monday, 23rd January. If more than one nomination/application is received, we will progress to a parent vote so that parents have a say in who represents them.
