SEVERE ALLERGIES CHANGE OF POLICY ON SNACKS

We really need everyone's support on this one please.

We have several children in school with severe:

peanut allergy

milk protein allergy

chocolate allergy

tomato allergy

In some cases these children have anaphylactic shocks triggered by the smell of the above in the air or on people's breath.

For this reason, we ask that you do not provide your child with any nuts or nut based product for their snack or packed lunch, including peanut butter.

BREAK TIME SNACKS MAY ONLY BE FRUIT, RAISINS OR VEGGIES (not tomatoes) BOTH FROM SCHOOL OR WHEN BROUGHT IN FROM HOME.

Milk and products with milk proteins are carefully controlled on site. Sweets and cereal bars are not acceptable snacks, neither are crisps.

Where products state 'may include trace of nuts' – (this applies to almost everything!) we know that this cannot be avoided but do ask you to exercise caution.

Parent information sessions What is my child learning & how are they catching up?

We had got into a good rhythm last year of sharing this vital information with you at the beginning of each half term and we don't want that to drop off but clearly can't have a hall packed with people.


Teachers will be recording a briefing for you and we'll post it on your child's Google classroom and also on the class pages of our website on WEDNESDAY 23RD SEPT.

Parent Governor vacancy

We have a brilliant Governing body whose role is to support and challenge and see the strategic vision for the school come to life. It is led by Catherine Williamson, supported in the Vice Chair role by Miriam White with 8 other governors supporting them. We have a vacancy for a parent to join the Governing body and support our existing group in ensuring the longevity of the school and providing a strategic insight into the life of the school.

Parent Governors are on the Governing body to represent the views of the parents and give a vital insight into a parent's perspective when we are discussing both the current picture of the school as well as the long term future. They are not on the Governing body to look out for 'their child' – in fact, it's important that a parent governor represents all views, even if not necessarily their own!

What would my role be?

Governors as a whole have been a key support during COVID closures and have continued to meet virtually to ensure school business is uninterrupted by the pandemic. Each governor brings their own skill set to the team; accountancy, community knowledge, understanding of legal or health and safety processes, specialist knowledge of Early Years, marketing, human resources...I could go on! We have completed a skills audit recently and would very much welcome applications for the post of Parent Governor from anyone with experience in financial management, marketing or Human Resources.

What's the commitment?

We meet once a month and continue to do so virtually at present, usually on a Monday evening from 6pm. We do not have separate committees but run a 'flat structure' so that all Governors understand and are involved in, all business areas.


You will also be expected to support the leadership team with monitoring and be linked to a subject area in school. This might mean a visit once every 6 weeks to school to undertake a monitoring activity although sometimes things like the budget or website compliance can be done remotely.

I'm interested, what should I do?

In the first instance, you could speak to Mrs Jefferies, Miriam White (who is also a Parent Governor) or Catherine Williamson who has been a parent here and is now the Chair. She is available by emailing the school office; adminoffice@stockbridge.hants.sch.uk

We can all talk to you about the role and the application process. If we have more than 1 applicant, it will be put to a parent vote. A ballot system is entered into in these circumstances, If there is only 1 applicant and their skillset meets the needs of the Governing body, we will progress forwards from there.

We are keen to have more parent representation on the Governing Body as soon as possible so we would welcome any expressions of interest by Tuesday 22nd September please.
