Homework

I know, you're over home learning!
I don't blame you! As a school, we have a fairly 'light' policy on homework for many reasons – we do ask you however to do the stuff that really counts and that we just can't do enough of in school.

School are pouring thousands of pounds into small class sizes and extra adults to help children catch up in their individual year groups and we have clear expectations for catch up this half term so I thought it would be timely to lay out what we expect children to do for homework:

ALL children should...

Read with an adult at least 4 times a week – yes, this even includes Years 5 & 6! If these older children don't read aloud, the more complex vocabulary will be misunderstood, misread and they will lose all sense of meaning.

Do 4 spelling journal activities each week linked to spellings in their book. Their books should go between home and school each day. Years 3-6 need to complete their read & respond each week in their reading journal.

Year 2, 3,4, 5 & 6 should also...

Log on and spend 20 mins in Garage in TTRockStars (see opposite)

Years 4, 5 & 6 should also...

Complete activities from their independent topic homework set on Google classroom. This is available from today and should be in in the last week of the half term.

Year 4 need to do 2 activities

Year 5 need to do 3 activities

Year 6 need to do 4 activities

Parent's Evening

All of our carefully laid plans were scuppered slightly by COVID closures and partial opening. Given the current lockdown restrictions, I don't feel it's sensible or in the spirit of the lockdown to hold face to face, in person meetings.

We will be holding our meetings virtually using a company who are specialists in this and come highly recommended from other schools. You will be able to book a slot online and then log in on the day, at your time and be connected to your child's class teacher virtually.

More details will be out next Tuesday in readiness for parent's evening slots on Monday 16th, Tuesday 17th or Wednesday 18th.



In school, we have a huge focus this term on learning our times tables that are appropriate for each year group. Times Tables Rock Stars is the way to practice this at home and a central part of the core homework we ask children to do every week.

We have relaunched Times Tables Rockstars as it develops the children's understanding and links between multiplication and division facts, while building their confidence and speed of recall.

Children from Y2 upwards should log on to the 'garage' section, at least three times a week for 20 minutes. We will do an additional session in school. We can track how many times they log on for and for how long and we can also check their speed is increasing.

We have also now set this area to 'automatic training' which will ensure that all the appropriate times tables for your child's year group are secure with quick recall speeds and that any gaps in times table knowledge are sufficiently addressed before they move on. These means that any previous targets are now reset and that your child will work their way through the times tables, building their confidence and speed of recall as they go.

Please do have a look – there are other photos of your child on there, not just the one on the card.


If you have mislaid yours or not received it, please see the school office.
