

We have a few things up our sleeve as a result and will be rolling them out across the classes in the next week. Watch out in GC for updates.

# Parent's evenings

We will be using the same SchoolCloud software for our parent's evenings again and the link to book a slot is on the front of this newsletter.

Now that we've all experienced it at least once, please bear in mind the following:

- We have allocated 10mins per child for you to talk with your child's class teacher
- The time counts down and cuts us off at 10mins
   this can feel rather abrupt!
- Please use Dojo to message your child's teacher before the appointment if there is something specific you'd like to discuss/know about
- Log onto SchoolCloud 5-10mins before the appointment as it automatically 'picks you up' and connects us so we all need to be ready to go!

# Staff COVID tests

This week we began lateral flow testing. All staff have chosen to take part so that we can protect each other as much as possible.

We will be taking tests on Monday and Thursday mornings nd staff will text me before 7.30am to notify me if they have a positive result.

If we have to close a class because of a positive test, we will notify you as soon as is humanly possible but it's likely to feel quite last minute. We are taking tests on the morning as this is recommended as the safest and most reliable time to take them and we want as up to the minute results as possible.

I have attended several meeting with other headteachers meetings this week and we are all following the same guidance.
