This is worrying for your child as they don't know where you are and sometimes, neither do we! If your child is attending clubhouse, please ensure they are booked in and know they are going.

e-safety reminder

We have experienced a number of children discussing tiktok and gaming this week – all of which are well outside our children's age range of appropriateness.

Games with a rating of 12+ and apps such as tiktok are designed for older children who are able to understand and discriminate between content which is appropriate and not. Frankly, children we have talked to this week have said that they have been frightened by what they've been playing/seen but because their parents do it, they perceive it to be OK.

I hope the video link, attached to this week's newsletter email is a useful reminder of who children have access to online and that this is wholly inappropriate for children of primary age.

e-safety lessons

This half term started with a whole school focus on E-safety following the theme of copyright and ownership. Some children learnt how to make safe searches using the child friendly search engine 'swiggle.org.uk' and how to use this as a way of finding material that is free to use. They revised how material can be accessed online but that it is not all free to be copied and used by others. The children learnt how to identify online material that is copyright free by using websites such as pixabay.

Scooter and cycle pod

You've probably noticed our sparkly new signage around the site and the rather lovely looking scooter pod near the White Hart gate. Children can now park their scooters and bikes in this pod AND the old pod in the courtyard in Old London Road.

However, the new pod is near the unlocked gate onto the main road so I would recommend padlocking your scooter/bike up when leaving it in this pod. There are obvious places on the pod itself for you to put a chain or bike lock into. Anything left in these pods is at your own risk and all we can do is recommend this as good practice for your children to understand.
