COVID

From Monday, schools will officially no longer act as 'track and trace' agents – if you or your child has a +ve PCR test, NHS Test and Trace will deal with notifying close contacts and isolations. That said, Hampshire are sensibly asking us to maintain this function until the end of next week and liaise with our colleagues at Public Health England on any isolations and bubble closures.

It is therefore crucial that you keep us informed as we are more likely to know who your child has been playing with or sat next to in class!

When we return in September, we will have a 2 week settling in period. This means that we will be in smaller bubbles for the first two weeks, still asking you to wear masks and still asking children to play in their class groups for this time period so that any isolations as a result of holidays away etc are limited to as small a number as possible and do not mean large numbers of children having to isolate.

Hopefully then, from Monday 20th September, school will return to our pre-pandemic 'normal' – one can always hope!
