SPRAT & WINKLE

Thursday was the first full day of school and children were immersed in learning all about the Little Red Hen. We've learnt the story off by heart and Mrs Cooper is going to upload it to Dojo so that you can enjoy it too!

Children have also learnt the numbers 1 and 2 and begun finding them in their environment. Although our reading books have no words, we've been making predictions about what might happen.

HORSEBRIDGE Year 2/3 by Florence & Ava

We've been learning about places like London – it's the capital of our country. We've been learning about it through a girl called Katy who leapt on a lion and had a tour of London. We'd love to do that. He showed her around and they saw Tower of London where the Queen keeps all her jewels. Kings and Queens used to live there.

We learned that there's double decker red buses, black taxis and trains that go underground – you can find these with red circle and blue line signs the we've been using the part part whole model to explore 2 digit numbers. Miss T is teaching us all about using adjectives in our work and practicing really need handwriting. Adjectives describe something like little or magnificent.

CLATFORD Year 5/6 by Violet, Betsy & Cosima

We've been learning all about place Value charts and doing a lot of problem solving but Mrs Natt makes us show our answers in lots of different ways so she knows we've understood. We've also been going up into much bigger numbers; ten thousands and millions.

In our English, we did art!! We listened to some music and let the music guide us in our choice of colours and patterns. We collages too with messages to help others to save our planet.

We've also been doing lots of tests this week so that Mrs Natt knows what we can and can't do and can help us get better.

It was tiring coming back to school after out week out at Calshot – we used some of the things we learnt about working together there back here in school. In maths we've been learning about one x and y axis for co-ordinates and plotting points on a grid and we've also been learing about translating and reflecting and rotating shapes – Betsy thinks this is like flipping a pancake! Riley put this in our maths toolbox as a great way to remember how to do this as well as the rhyme "along the corridor and up the stairs.

We had a sneaky art day where we made collages about protecting the planet for pollution because our big question this term is 'can one person make a difference?" Our guided reading is a book called 'The Last Wild' – it's set in the new possible future all about a virus called 'red eye' but no one knows where it comes from. We've been learning how to summarise the second chapter in 25 words – it's tricky!!

HOMEWORK & LIAISON WITH YOU

We believe that communication with you is such an important part of our home/school relationship and where we have been unable to meet face to face we have had to make use of technology to do this.



As we start a new school year we are going to be rolling out Class Dojo across all classes, including Sprat and Winkle and Pre-school where it will be used to replace Tapestry. Class Dojo is a place to share learning through photographs and videos and where we will occasionally send a whole class message or reminder. Just as you love to see what we all get up to at school, we also love seeing the learning and achievements from home so please do share them with us.

Messaging clasteachers.....Please only use the messaging part of Class Dojo to send the type of message you would ordinarily pass on at the beginning of the day. Any others should be emailed to the school office to be passed on to your class teacher.

Every child from Sprat and Winkle through to year 6 also has a Google Classroom account. This is used regularly in school and the place where homework is set and is to be completed or uploaded. This will also be the main platform that any online learning will take place if the need ever arises again. Because class work is regularly uploaded on Google Classroom I recommend you disable notifications for now and your classteacher will let you know via Class Dojo if there is something on there that you may need to check.



If your child tells you they have no homework – check Google Classroom – there's sure to be some on there!!

Mrs Jefferies has set this week's homework for the whole school.

For both platforms you will have individual log ins, if you don't have them please let your class teacher know and they can help you out with this.

Spellings

We are introducing children to a new spelling scheme this term and their spelling journals will be coming home NEXT Friday when we have been able to model how to use them and what to do with their spellings.

Times Tables Rock Stars

Years 2-6 have 3x a week practice on TT Rocks. In 'GARAGE', they can practice without the timer and we encourage them to do this for the next 3 weeks. We'll let you know when to start using the timer.

Reading

Just because your child can read words, doesn't mean they understand what they're reading and that's the whole point of reading – to learn new things and jump into a new adventure! Please, please make sure you hear them read at least 4 or 5 times a week, yes, even Year 6!

If it's a battle reading with them, try reading a bit yourself and they pick up a sentence every now and again. It'll give them the opportunity to explore new vocabulary and try out voices and all sorts of things.

Children should be completing a 'read and respond activity from Year 3 upwards in their reading journals.
