COVID clarity

Please read the leaflet, sent home on Tuesday in preparation for our return to school which outlines answers to as many scenarios as we could think of relating to COVID.


The Guitar concert is still planned for an 'inperson' event on Wednesday 26th January at 9.15am

- Years R 6 also focus on music every morning for 40mins on their 4 weekly cycle


Reading
