Over the past fortnight we have had a great time getting down to some basic fun whilst encouraging some core skills. We called this our focus fortnight. A chance to revisit some essential skills needed as part of every child's early development.

We have made use of the obstacle equipment both in the pre-school garden and the school hall. Balancing along beams, jumping off equipment, throwing and catching quoits while using our listening ears to follow instructions. Yes they can do it if they focus and try!

Our attention inside has been to encourage all the children to find and independently put on their own belongings such as shoes, coats or find lunchboxes at the end of the day. We help those making great attempts independently first.

During meal times they independently find a cup, plate, and cutlery and they use this too, please don't let them trick you in to believing they need you for everything. We have some very independent and capable 2, 3 and 4 year olds cutting up food and pouring their own drinks. We are superheroes at Stockbridge!

In the art area the children have created some amazing bubble print pictures, the aim of this was to strengthen oral motor muscles whilst having lots of fun. Encouraging clarity of speech. It was especially funny to see their reaction when they looked in the mirror and saw their new multi coloured freckles after doing this activity. We hope you liked their pictures?

We have enjoyed group games such as lycra and parachute as well as singing and dancing.

Have a great half term, we'd love to see what you've been up to by you posting on DoJo. If we know what you've been doing, we can use it to help plan your child's provision next half term & settle them quickly back after half term.
