Homework

Thank you so much to all who turned out for the parent information sessions on Tuesday this week. I hope that they helped give you an insight into what your child will be learning over the coming weeks and our aspirations for them to achieve before the summer break.

We're sending home a copy of the presentation for each year group so that every parent has this.

I'm sure the teachers you've met with have talked to you all about homework!! Just to clarify:

ALL children should be heard read at home please – yes, even Year 6s! In fact, especially Years 5 & 6 when they are encountering more challenging vocabulary and concepts.

ALL children in Years 1-6 have spelling homework – focus five spellings where words will be replaced as and when children use and apply them independently in their work. At home, children should practice their spelling lists in the ways detailed on the inside front cover of their spelling logs.

ALL children in Years 1-6 have maths homework: Years 2-6 on TTRock Stars practicing their times tables. Children in Year 1 should practice counting in 2s, 5s and 10s as much as humanly possible!

Children in Years 4, 5 & 6 also have topic homework which has already been sent home this week.

Tile Barn success
