Zig Zags

Parking or stopping on zig zags anywhere is ILLEGAL.

This week I have witnessed traffic jams of up to 6 cars, a narrow miss accident and literally countless cars stopping on zig zags to drop children off.

Every time you stop on zig zags, you are putting our children at risk. I would rather children be late to school than you stop on the zig zags to drop them off as it puts all pedestrians at risk and creates annoyances for other drivers.

Zig zags are marked on roads to keep entrances to schools and other important areas CLEAR OF TRAFFIC, not to indicate a drop off zone. Because of our location, we cannot provide a drop off zone unfortunately (this is something we've explored with HCC) so please park up and walk in.

We have a huge space at the back of our building and, on chatting with parents over the last year, they've reported challenges in finding adequate baby and toddler groups in our local area.
