The children have also learnt the number they call for help and know they can ask a police man/lady for help if they get lost etc. We have drawn roads on the floor and included pedestrian crossings both to engage in road safety and big mark making, building up their strength in their upper bodies ready for writing in school.

Thank you to those who attended the parent information evening, where we focused on the early year's curriculum. It is really valuable to the children when we work together to help them reach their potential.

Lunches

Sports Day- Monday 18th July (am)

Many of you have made enquires about Pre-school taking part on sports day. Staff are only able to accommodate those children usually in on a Monday session due to the high ratios we need to maintain and support required for this event. The children will be taking part in a few short races such as egg and spoon, running, and obstacle race. If your child is not normally in on that day, you are welcome to attend (we understand you may be also watching siblings) although Pre-school staff will not be responsible for them during this time. We will need an adult to stay with them and supervise them. Please indicate if you would like your child to take part in a race to Mrs Evans, so she can plan accordingly. Not every child will be running every race.









Resources - We need your help!

Children learn best when using items and resources they see you use at home, the language and level of their play and interactions is greatly improved with real life items. The mathematical learning concepts with scales, use of language, social skills and turn taking skills is really enhanced when engaged in role play.

Our mud kitchen and role play gets a lot of use and the mud kitchen is outside in all weathers.
