# Impact of PE Premium spending 2020-21

Our Intent:

- Learning in Physical Education is underpinned by our School's Vision and Values and by the National Curriculum and Early Years Foundation Stage guidance.
- Children at Stockbridge will experience a variety of physical opportunities both within PE lessons, at break time and lunchtime, and through competitive opportunities in and outside of school allowing them to be active.
- From our curriculum, pupils will become physically educated through experiencing a range of activity areas that:
  - Encourages and requires the need to work **collaboratively** with others
  - Develop competence in a range of physical skills, concentrating on fundamental movement skills in Key Stage One, and to be **proud** of their achievements, always aiming to better their best
  - Help them to be open-minded and show **respect** to the various talents of each and every one of us and celebrate individual achievement
  - Promote creativity and **resourcefulness** across a variety of activities
  - Instil a **resilience** both in sport and life to help them as they leave us into secondary school and then to the wider world
  - Build their leadership skills by taking on the **responsibility** to lead others
  - Allow children to gain enjoyment from being active and encourage children to live healthy lives both physically and mentally

## **Cluster competitions and events**

Cluster competitions began again the autumn term with a full programme of festivals and competitions with opportunities for pupils in years 1-6

Two events were unable to run due to COVID restrictions but the rest of the programme provided opportunities for a large number of children to attend an event.

### **Residential**

All children from each year group in key stage 2 were able to attend residential this year. The PE funding was used to supplement this in order to reduce the cost for the adventurous activities. Children were given the opportunity to take part in:

Year 4 – climbing

Year 5 – kayaking, skiing, archery, climbing

Year 6 – canoeing, caving, mountain walking

### **Swimming**

Last summer we funded intense swimming lessons for children in years 4 and 5 who were unable to swim 25m and who did not have water confidence. This year all year 2s, 4s and 5 children from year 5 had a week of swimming lessons. The 5 children in year 5 will be funded an additional intensive swimming course for the summer holiday 2022. Currently 75% of year 5s can swim at least 25m and 85% of year 6s can.

### **PE Apprenticeships**

Both LSAs completed their PE apprenticeships, which included training in the teaching of swimming, bikeability, multiskills, gymnastics.

### **Trim Trail**

A decision was made to replace rather than repair the trim trail. The money allocated for the repairs was put towards the costs of this. This was replaced in Summer 2022 and used daily by all children across the school, including preschool.
