



School uniform

School uniform offers children a sense of belonging. When thinking about this, the children gave these reasons for wearing uniform:

- ❖ It shows we represent the school
- ❖ It promotes a team spirit
- ❖ We all look smart

Uniform consists of:

- White poloshirt or shirt for day day wear
During class time these should be tucked in – therefore please avoid buying “fitted” blouses or similar clothing which makes this difficult.
- Red jumper or cardigan with a school logo – please DO NOT buy these without a logo as this is a safe and quick way to identify children when out on a trip.
- Grey dress (*from Easter to October, this can be a red gingham dress*)
- Grey skirt*
- Grey skorts*
- Grey shorts*
- Grey or black trousers

**We have a winter uniform which is all items above with the exception of shorts from the beginning of December to end of February half term. If the weather is particularly mild, we will let you know of any delay to the start of this policy.*

We also recommend that children wearing skirts wear tights in these months or long socks with a pair of cycling ‘lycra’ shorts underneath for additional warmth.

PE Kit consists of:

PE Kit should be brought into school on a **Monday morning** in a **small** named bag and hung from your child’s coat peg. It should remain in school until **Friday afternoon** to return home for washing.

Please remember to clearly label all of your child’s clothing.

Hair styles should be sensible and should not include those that involve large amounts of hair gel or fashionable ‘lines’ being cut into the sides of the head.

Children should wear only a watch and *stud* earrings to school; rings, bracelets and necklaces are not allowed for health and safety reasons.

County stipulates that jewellery **MUST NOT** be worn for PE lessons. If your child is unable to remove stud earrings, please provide plasters so that they can be covered.
