Hopefully your child will have talked about our WOW walk to school challenge that the whole school has embarked upon – even preschool can join in!

We are working to promote a more active way of coming to and from school which will also help alleviate traffic near to school and reduce pollution near our school gate.

We've teamed up with Living Streets to help encourage children to travel more actively. We're working towards all being awarded a badge, each month for active travel.

All children need to do to earn April's badge is travel to school at least once a week in a more active way such as:

- ☐ Parking further away from school (at least the Co-op) and;
  - Walking
  - scooting
  - Cycling
- ☐ Walking from home
- ☐ Cycling from home
- ☐ Scooting from home

Of course, if your child attends breakfast club or you simply don't have time to park and stride, scoot or cycle in, they can earn a point towards active travel by walking or running around the playground 6 times before 9am. In April, they only need to do it once a week to earn their badge. In May, it'll be twice a week.

These are the 'how to' of moving around school. We wanted to ensure children know how we expect them to behave and they help us respect that others are still learning.

Our values are specifically linked to learning & life behaviours and are referenced every day by every member of staff. We use the effort mountain and learning pit in class to talk about our learning when it gets challenging but we know we have to use the learning from these values to be a good learner and get out of the pit!
