New topics this term are as follows:

Sprat & Winkle

I SEE SEASHELLS ON THE SEASHORE

We're all off to the beach to explore this week and that really kicks off our topic in Year R. We'll be exploring all things aquatic at the Oceanarium and also witnessing the power of the sea as well as the sounds it makes and how we feel when we're at the beach. We'll consider our 'big' question – "who does the world belong to?"

Lower School (Years 1-3)

ROMANS

After a healthy and active term last half term, we continue this one as we learn about the Romans and the legacy they left here in the United Kingdom. We'll practically explore their army, their lifestyle and consider the big question "Are the consequences always worth it?"

Upper School (Years 4-6)

SUMMER SEAS

With coastal geographic exploration at the heart of this topic, children will also engage with a heavy Science topic of reversible and irreversible changes, states of matter and the water cycle. Books read will focus on refugees and immigrants and our big question is 'is change always good?'

Slip, Slap, Slop, Slide & Shade

Whilst we're welcoming the weather with open arms, it does mean that the sunshine brings with it some additional requirements to keep your children safe. We have been issued with a heatwave warning for today all the way through until Monday so please ensure now that the warmer weather seems here to stay that you;

Slip on a t-shirt

Slop on the sun cream (SPF30+)

Slap on a wide brimmed hat

Slide on sunglasses

Shade from the sun whenever possible

What that looks like in practical terms each day for school:

- Supply a sun hat every day for your child
- Suncream up before school
- Send suncream into school in a named bottle and preferably, inside a plastic bag in case of leaks
- Make sure they have a full water bottle each day we can refill in school as many times as they like.

Children are only able to apply their own suncream and cannot share bottles between friends (between siblings is fine!). We can point out where they haven't rubbed it in well enough!!

We will use the willow structures and gazebos as shade and we will walk the daily mile instead of running it until the temperatures cool a little. We all need to stay safe in the sun.

Keeping you up to date with regular goings on in school

Behaviour series - episode #4

In our first parent forum, we have discussed how our behavior policy is evolving and parents felt it would be helpful to focus an aspect of our policy in the newsletter so that you as parents understand how things are working. At the most recent forum, we decided on a useful order so here goes....

Expectations for different ages

Whilst we have a school behavior policy and clear values that we live by, we realise that children are all on a journey and they don't always get it right – do we ever always get it right as adults? Our new behavior policy this year is designed to accommodate this non-linear development and recognise that although we may be dealing with, for example, two10 year olds, their understanding and maturity may not be at the same level as each other.

Power & Identity

This is a stage of THRIVE child development which is generally where children aged 3-7 years old 'sit'. Their stills and understanding will vary depending on age but typically, this is the stage where children:

- Can express their likes and preferences (as well as dislikes) in an age appropriate way
- Like sharing their own ideas with their peers and adults
- Are learning to express feelings in a way that's safe and healthy
- Have strong feelings and can link these to the sensations they feel in their body eg. hot when angry, having a headache when stressed
- Co-operate with others and seek out others for friendship and fun
- Learn that when you upset someone, you need to take responsibility for making amends

Skills & structure

The next stage on from Power & Identity, this is where children aged 7-11 years usually operate. At this stage children:

- Have a growing confidence in themselves and offer ideas and opinions
- Want to learn a special skill and are ready to engage in the structure expectation and commitment that is part of this
- Know how to keep themselves safe and want to branch our from home
- Respond sensitively to others and like exploring and finding out about values and ideas held by themselves and others
- Recognise that what they believe in and how they behave are linked
- Manage the fallout if disagreeing with friends
- Beginning to recognise social rules within and outside of autheir own immediate context and why these differ

School meals

Hampshire School Catering have put up their prices once again in response to rising wage and food costs and all school meals will be £3 per child, per day.

If your child is in Year R, 1 or 2, they are still entitled to a free meal as part of the Universal Free School Meal programme however, you should be aware that it's not free to us at al! The school have to subsidise this cost by 61p per day per child as the Government do not fund us for £3 per child. This costs the school, at current rates, £5,382 a year.

We are currently investigating alternative mea providers and will report back in due course.

Calpol and Piriteze

You may remember signing a form to give permission for us to give your child Calpol or Piriteze in the event of an emergency. We are happy to do this as a one off if a child becomes poorly during the day.

If your child comes to school feeling not 100% and you've given them Calpol at home, please let us have your home bottle so that we can administer more during the day. This ensures that the school, who do not have deep pockets, will have enough medication to go around if and when the need arises. You will need to come into the office and sign medical consent for this.

Similarly, with Piriteze, please administer this on a morning before school if they are suffering with allergies.

Permission slips and money

Please remember to send permission slips back in well ahead of school visits and other events. Not only will it save you receiving a nagging phone call from the school, it will free our office staff up to do other vital jobs. We regret, we are unable to take any child on a school visits further afield from Stockbridge itself if we do not have your written prior permission.

Please use the black box outside of the office on the wall to post all monies and reply slips – we do check it daily!

The children all did so well with the London Marathon challenge and it's time to have all sponsor monies in now please. Parent forum had a lengthy discussion about sponsored events and minutes from our meeting will be out in the next week so please do read them through carefully.
