#### **Sports Day**

Sports Day is looming on Monday  $17^{th}$  July and the weather is looking, well, very British!! We might need raincoats and suncream according to current forecasts.

Please assume it's going ahead unless the weather is exceptionally hot or persistently wet. If we need to cancel, we'll wait until Sunday night and then make a decision.

Your child will need:

- To come to school in their school uniform please
- Have their full PE kit and a family colour t-shirt yellow, red, green or blue depending on their family group.
- They must have trainers please.
- A water bottle that's full of water, not juice please; it simply doesn't do the same job as water in rehydrating them.

Parents, grandparents and family members are welcome to come along too. The morning will begin by 9.15am and end just before lunch. Please do bring a picnic blanket, camping chairs etc.

FOSS will be selling early morning and break time teas and coffees and a range of pastries. Children will have a break mid-morning and FOSS are kindly providing fresh fruit as a snack.

#### Organisation

To help things run smoothly, the morning is divided into 2 parts;

PART 1 – Family groups (mixed ages) will compete at stations around the field in a 'round robin' – they will record their personal best times/distances/counts. Parents etc are encouraged to support their children at each event. Siblings are in family groups together making it easy for you to follow your children's progress.

BREAK – during the break, pre-school children will run their races so please be there to cheer them on. This should be about 10.30am

PART 2 – Competitive element on the race track. Parents etc will be on one side, children on the other. Children are supported and managed by staff. Please refrain from calling your child to you. Parents & family members are not allowed to cross the track to their child. There will be parent races so be prepared to be harangued!!

We will end the morning under the beech trees and hand out the family trophy – it was won by the green family last year – I wonder who will receive it this year?

#### **Transition**

Next week, we have transition afternoons and today, we have held our first stay and play session for our new year R children.

You will receive your child's report next Wednesday and then the first transition with their new class will be on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> July from 2pm – 3pm. You will all receive a letter, confirming which class your child will be in next year on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> at 2pm so that you are aware of this before meeting your child at the end of the day.

We will return to the usual arrangement of classes in upper school in September so Mrs Natt will teach Year 4/5 and Mr Taylor Year 5/6. Mrs McClue, as you will be aware from previous newsletters, will cover all PPA and release time as well as have dedicated SENDCo time on Thursdays.

We will be positively bursting at the seams in September in all classes despite having to say farewell to our current Year 6 and a few other friends across the school. Lucy, Harper and Grace, all in Year 2, have exciting new adventures to head to and Eden (Y4) and Isaac (Y1) are off to Wales and will be visiting their new school on Monday. We therefore have 5 new children to join our school who will hopefully make it in for our transition afternoons.

#### Music

This week we held the summer term piano recital led ably by Mr Seymour. He has the patience of a saint and has inspired and encouraged lots of new pianists to make excellent progress.



Despite admitting to nerves ahead of their first performance 6 children in Years 2 & 3 took centre stage and played brilliantly for the first time to a live audience of 120 people! They were joined by Jack, Charlie, Thomas, Joshua and Poppy from Upper School who gave great examples of what can be achieved if you practice and are resilient at learning the tricky skill.

If you would like your child to play piano next year, we will be issuing sign up forms in the first week back after the summer holidays. It will be important to get it returned quickly as places with Mr Seymour are popular. The same will apply to guitar lessons with Kev. A guitar concert has been arranged for 2.30pm on Wed 19<sup>th</sup> July.

## Reports

- Standardised scores for all children in Years 1 to 6
- Early Years outcomes for Year R

- If your Year 2 child didn't pass phonics last year, you will also receive an updated phonics check score.
- Year 2 SATs outcomes
- Year 4 Multiplication Check results
- Year 6 SATs outcomes
