#### Travelling Food Pantry

We are delighted to announce a new permanent arrangement with Unity Andover who are able to provide a new travelling food pantry which will visit our school **every Friday morning from 9.30am**.

The pantry exists to support families in these challenging financial times. It costs  $\pounds$ 5 each week and you are able to select goods to the value of  $\pounds$ 15. We will be able to offer fruit, vegetables and dry goods which will hopefully help out a little bit as heating needs switching back on and fires need to be lit which will all take a toll on family finances.

It's taken a lot of effort on Unity's part and in liaison with us, to get this up and running so please do pass tis on to anyone else in the community who may need access to it – it's not just for school families

Our school goes above and beyond to develop the 'whole' child – looking beyond just English and Maths to support children's wider understanding and experiences of the world.


#### In the last fortnight;

## Financial support for your child

We are coming up to the annual census (first Thursday in October) and this is a crucial date for all schools as our budgets are set for the following year depending on the number of children on roll.

#### We are putting out a call to all families to see if you are eligible for the Pupil Premium.

If you are eligible, the school receives over £1300 to be spent on your child through the Pupil Premium. You are likely to meet this criteria if you receive Universal credit, are on income support, bring £16,190 into the household each year or meet some of the other criteria. Either Mrs Spayes or Mrs Jefferies would be happy to go through this application with you or talk more about how we use this money to benefit your child.
