We began a new focus this week looking at nursery rhymes as part of national nursery rhyme week, and whilst many of you may think your child knows them, there are many elements to these important milestones in the early years. To quote the National literacy trust, "Nursery rhymes are extremely valuable to support language and communication skills, build confidence and prepare children for reading and writing as they get older." Children need to hear, see, sing and act out these life experiences and we chose to start with a bakers shop in our role play. The children have been showing interest in cookery prior to this, and of course we have been making Pudsey biscuits for children in need. The flour play has encouraged so much language and mathematical development it's been great to see. This forms part of our top 10 early year's curriculum for 3 and 4 year olds. Being able to maintain attention, participate with rhyme and songs to begin making their own rhyming connections. Language is a strong focus as part of our literacy development and this is underpinning everything we do in preschool from verbal conversations but spotting print and forming imaginative stories of their own.
