The various groups who hold responsibilities are also beginning to realise their roles and shape them to this cohort of children.

In the first week of school after the holidays, Year 5, Mrs McClue and I went off to Calshot for the first of our residentials for the year. Year 5 were standout brilliant! They began by telling us they "don't feel like Year 5's, we still feel like Year 4" but by the end of the week, their confidence was soaring high and they definitely stepped up to meet the challenges.

With poor weather forecast, they are the first group with me to every do rifle shooting and snowboarding and they were truly excellent! They also braved the rain in a determined fashion on the Friday morning to kayak, travelling out into the Solent and drifting into the bay caused by the land formation there. This provided a safe space to play in the kayaks and master the paddling.

We do this residential so early in the year so that we can use the findings from it in lessons and throughout school. We see children face challenges, have to organise themselves and try new things that they may not be brilliant at first time. All of this is critical learning for progress in Year 5.

E-Safety

The beginning of term has brought another round of E-safety in school. Each year group focuses on a different aspect that is age appropriate for the class. Please can you discuss these topics with your children to reinforce the learning that has been taking place in school.

Horsebridge – In Horsebridge this half term, we have looked at the different online services that we have access to. We also looked at the importance of keeping our details private and how we can change our personal information to make it less identifiable.

Redbridge – In Redbridge we have been working on staying safe when using passwords, we have looked at good and bad passwords. We discussed what made a good password and how we need to keep them to ourselves.

Mottisfont – In Mottisfont this half term we have been looking at privacy and security online. We looked at how we can use the internet safely and the importance of not sharing personal information online.

Clatford - In Clatford we have been looking at self-image and identity online, we looked at how we can stay safe as well as how we need to be aware of the dangers of sharing our identity online.
