Whilst all this fun is happening the children are also learning and developing muscle strength, pulling and sucking up water in syringes, squeezing sponges, painting fences with rollers using large arm movements. All these early skills are essential ready for writing and smaller coordination and control movements.

We have been making ice-lollies, which children are pouring and filling and placing in the freezer, so learning about science concepts from liquid to solid.

Age milestones – is your child age appropriate?

As experienced practitioners in child development and education we are always closely observing and listening out for new skills, and the small steps which encourage progression in learning. We have previously shared our top 10 curriculum with you and continue to point out skills being developed through activities using Class dojo entries.

For those of you who would like to encourage and recognize the important milestones that children should go through at different ages and stages I have attached a link for you to browse. All children develop at different rates but this guide has been created as a general rule of developmental markers.

It can help you to observe changes in your children or encourage areas that you can see are not yet achieved. This is especially helpful for those going to school in September and you can continue to work towards promoting a successful start to their learning and school journey.

Library and summer reading challenge

The borrowing of a school library book is going well and nearly all of you are regularly borrowing and returning books – thank you for engaging so brilliantly! This is great to encourage new reading and repetition of a book so your child can join in, ask questions and learn new words – Don't be afraid to use big words this enriches their knowledge. I recently used the word 'evaporation' with a child and they went home and shared this big word they had learnt at pre-school with good understanding of its meaning.

The local library service will be running their annual summer reading challenge. This can be completed both in person and online. Children as young as early years can take part and parents can support them with developing a love of books, reading and engaging in an imaginative world.

If you take part, we love to know in September both in year R and pre-school where we will celebrate and continue the learning.
