Keeping you up to date with regular goings on in school

Year R

We also have a workshop for parents, delivered by Papaya, after half term on Wed 19th November at 6pm.

This will help you set up security settings, set healthy boundaries and make informed choices on use of phones and online gaming for your children. We are paying for this so it's completely free to you!
