Children's concentration and focus

One of the common themes from parent teacher meets this year has been a collective observation of children's attention and concentration span.

The world is a very busy and often noisy environment with many distractions around us; as adults we can feel this and get distracted. Try to imagine how hard this is for children who are experiencing a highly digital exposure from a young age. TV, audio stories, computer games, lpads and more have a time and place but should not be a substitute for adult and peer social interactions. These digital gadgets are designed to distract, and draw you into their world.

Here are some suggestions to promote better attention and concertation a fundamental skill required to progress well in other areas.

- Fresh air and movement breaks
- Share an age-appropriate puzzle, game and see this through to completion.
- Start with short engaging activities which your child enjoys sharing with you such as a story, a task – pair up the socks, hunt the toy, gardening, Hide and seek the shape
- Set a routine for Tv time, or iPad after a home activity.
- Ensure good bedtime routines, this is important for brain development as rest is when learning is embedded.
