Sometimes though, you need to draw a line and make the right choice clear so this week, we're taking 'nice and not nice' as the theme. It's easier than it sounds, the trick is keeping calm when you're doing it!

So, you're on your way out the door on a morning and your child's refusing to turn off the television or won't brush their teeth or on an evening, won't go upstairs to get ready for bed.

You've tried the 'nice & nice' eg. "you can turn the TV off or I can," and it's not making a difference. **STEP IT UP.**

Try "the TV needs to be turned off now or you won't be able to use it when you come home tonight." Or "either it's finished now, or it will have to be done instead of going to the park." Or "your toys need to go away now or we won't be able to play with them before bed."

What is your child learning...

...in **WRITING?**

S&W: This term we have been focusing on superhero themed books such as 'Super worm', 'Dan and Diesel' and 'A superhero like you' to name a few. We have been challenging ourselves to use finger spaces in our sentences and ending with a full stop. Next week in Drawing club we will be drawing pictures and writing sentences linked to the story 'Captain Green and the Plastic Scene'.

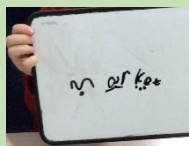
REDBRIDGE: In our first writing journey, we read the book 'Vlad and the Great Fire of London' and explored story mountains. We revisited punctuation rules and learnt how to use coordinating conjunctions to add extra information to our sentences. This week, we have begun our second journey during which we will focus on descriptive language.

HORSEBRIDGE: This term, the children have been writing diary entries from the perspective of William, a character from our book The Great Fire of London. They have learned the features of a diary and focused on using 'or' and 'but' conjunctions in year 2 and 'because' and 'if' in Year 3. They have been writing in first person and writing descriptive sentences about what would be experienced in the great fire. We have begun our new journey writing a non-chronological report using third person.

MOTTISFONT: This term, children have been learning how to write narratives. Our first narrative was based on Sinbad the Sailor, and we are currently working on a narrative based on the wordless book Journey. A key focus has been the use of dialogue. We have revised correct dialogue punctuation and learning how dialogue can be used to show not tell a character's emotions. Next week, children will focus on writing action by using short sentences and powerful verbs to create tension.

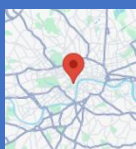
CLATFORD: In our first writing journey, the children revised our use of direct speech. We learnt how to use inverted commas correctly, what a reporting clauses was and where to place our punctuation. We then applied our learning to write a story of Aladdin from Jafar's point of view. In our second learning journey we have been studying Michael Rosen's poetry book 'On the Move' and have been investigating figurative language before writing a diary entry next week.

Year R



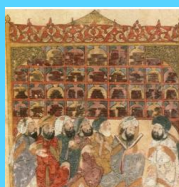
In Sprat and Winkle this week we have been learning all about longer words in our phonics lessons. We have learnt how many syllables there is in our names and used this to help us identify syllables in longer words. We have clapped out the syllables, segmented the sounds in the first syllable and write them down before doing the same for the second syllable. Our confidence is really growing!! Well done Sprat and Winkle class!

Lower School



In lower school the children have been comparing London and Stockbridge in Geography. We have been looking at human and physical features and seeing what is different about London's city landscape compared to rural villages like Stockbridge. In DT we have begun designing our own Tudor houses to make next week!

Upper School



In History, we have been researching famous scholars of the time period, learning that many of these people have impacted our lives. We created a hall of fame using our knowledge. In R.E we have continued our learning about Umma (community) and have enjoyed creating our own posters for groups that we participate in outside of school.

Clubhouse

This week in clubhouse was storytelling week! We have been discussing our favourite stories with each other and even role played some of our memorable parts in the story using the dressing up clothes. During this we thought very hard and tried to guess each other's stories.

Some of us made our own story books using our imagination to recreate or make up our own story.

You may have seen our new LSA based in Sprat and Winkle at clubhouse, Miss Futchter.

Miss Futchter will be running clubhouse bringing more exciting activities for your children to take part in.

It's winter Olympic week next week!

This will involve the children having a go at different types of sports such as Kurling. We will be creating our own mini snowballs and discovering hidden objects in frozen ice.
