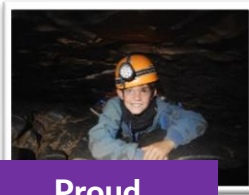

 Attendance & punctuality	• Check attendance regularly (half termly) & contact parents with any concerns immediately, seeking external support • Start lessons promptly so learning is maximised • Only authorise exceptional circumstances for absence	• Arrive at school ready for an 08:50. • Let school know by 9am if my/our child is too unwell to attend school • Only request leave of absence in exceptional circumstances	• Come to school every day (except when I'm too unwell) • Be on time so no learning is lost • Line up quietly and sensibly so that we are ready to learn
 Behaviour	• Build strong, healthy relationships with children • Find the good and celebrate it • Tackle inappropriate behaviour or bullying immediately • Be a safe space and provide an adult to talk to	• Encourage and praise children for the right behaviour and effort, not outcome. • Deal with issues from school alongside teaching staff • Let staff know of behaviour changes or concerns	• Always talk to someone if something is bothering you • Meet the Stockbridge Standards; WWW & SSS • Model our values • Show kindness to others in all we say and do
 Achievement	• Cover the widest curriculum and foster children's interests • Create opportunities for children to apply skills in real life • Support all abilities and ensure children 'keep up'	• Praise their efforts and learning • Support homework; create space, find the quiet, offer support, don't do it for them! • Read to or hear your child read at least x4/wk	• Work hard • Be resilient • Do work and take actions I am proud of • Ask good questions that will tell us more • Ignore distractions and don't create them for others
 Home/school links	• Meet with you termly to discuss progress • Communicate homework clearly • Have open lines of communication for trips, injuries and other issues	• Communicate with school when there are changes in home life • Make sure our children have access to the correct equipment eg. sports kit, uniform • Take part in sharing sessions and school events	• Learn my spellings 4 times a week • Read to an adult at home at least 4 times a week • Learn my times tables (where appropriate) • Be responsible for getting homework completed. • Be responsible – look after my belongings. KS2 children will bring what they need each day.
